The following report should be viewed as a series of hypotheses which may require further investigation. Individuals interpreting this evaluation should be knowledgeable in substance abuse problems and possess screening and assessment skills.

A: TEST TAKING ATTITUDE SCORE = (15)

This person's test taking attitude score suggests that he does not appear to feel a need to misrepresent himself on the test or during an interview.

B: BASIC PROBLEM SOLVING AND READING ASSESSMENT = (14)

The NEEDS Survey was completed in 34 minutes. This person appears to have some difficulties with basic reading and math skills even though he has finished school.

C: EMOTIONAL STABILITY ASSESSMENT = (35)

This person reports a history of emotional problems. Although his current emotional state appears to be stable at this time, further investigation should be considered.

- he reports having attempted suicide
- he reports being hospitalized for emotional problems
- he reports being physically and/or sexually abused during the past year
- he reports being convicted for assault
- he reports his childhood being less than positive
- he reports some possible feelings of low self esteem and unhappiness
- he reports having had racing thoughts
- he reports having been depressed, or that life was not worth living
- he reports having had experiences of sudden fear or panic for no reason
- he reports having had fear of public places
- his criminal history suggests attitudinal and/or emotional problems that require further investigation

D: SUBSTANCE ABUSE ASSESSMENT = (36)

This person identifies with behavior and symptoms associated with a drinking problem and possibly to a lesser extent a drug use problem as well.

- Suggested DSM-IV Classification based on Reported Drug of Choice: 305.40 Sedative, Hypnotic, or Anxiolytic Abuse

He reports his most frequently used drug as sedatives and reports his last use of it today. He reports his second most frequently used drug as barbiturates and reports his last use of it yesterday.

- Suggested DSM-IV Classification without Alcohol as a Drug of Choice: 303.90 Alcohol Dependence

This person reports weekly alcohol use. See Section L at the end of this report.

- he began using drugs at least once a month when he was 1
- he began drinking alcohol at least once a month when he was 2
- he reports being involved in 1 inpatient and 1 outpatient substance abuse treatments
- he reports being involved in 1 medical substance abuse detoxification(s)

E: EMPLOYMENT ASSESSMENT = (23)

This person is employed and reports 2 month(s) of full-time employment during the past year and 1 month(s) during the past three years. This person's reported months of employment and/or unemployment for the past year are inaccurate. Further investigation may be needed. This person has had little or no consistent work stability during the past three years.

- he rates his current employment situation as negative
- he indicates being on public assistance for 2 month(s) during the past year
- this person has had 2 job(s) during the past three (3) years
- his possible deficiencies in reading and/or problem solving may interfere with his ability to stay consistently employed
- his emotional instability may interfere with his job performance and employability
- he has been absent from work 2 day(s) during the past 12 months
- he reports having been involved a total of at least two times in the following financial difficulties: an eviction, a repossession, a garnishment, or bankruptcy

F: PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP AND SUPPORT SYSTEM ASSESSMENT = (12)

This person reports being married for between 1 and 2 years and rates this relationship as negative. He is currently living with his boy/girlfriend.

- he reports having 1 dependant child(ren) and rates his family life negatively
- he reports being physically or sexually abused during the past year
- he indicates that at least one of his immediate family members has spent time in jail

G: PHYSICAL HEALTH ASSESSMENT = (5)

This person reports some concerns about his physical health. The impact on his ability to function effectively may need to be evaluated.

- he reports that he is currently under a doctor's care

H: EDUCATION ASSESSMENT = (14)

This person has had 12 years of formal education, as well as additional special training. This person's reading and/or problem solving skills may need to be evaluated further.

- he has had little success in finding full-time employment during the past year

I: CRIMINAL HISTORY ASSESSMENT = (31)

J: OVERALL "NEEDS" ASSESSMENT = (53)

This person's need level is high. He not only has a severe substance abuse problem, but he has other need deficiencies as well. This individual will require at least a year's commitment to substance abuse treatment during which time attention can be focused on his other pressing need difficulties. This treatment should involve close supervision. He reports a history of emotional problems.

- his employment situation is unstable
- his support system appears to be somewhat unstable
- his problem solving and comprehension skills should be evaluated
- he may need special tutoring to increase his educational level
- he reports health issues that could be causing problems

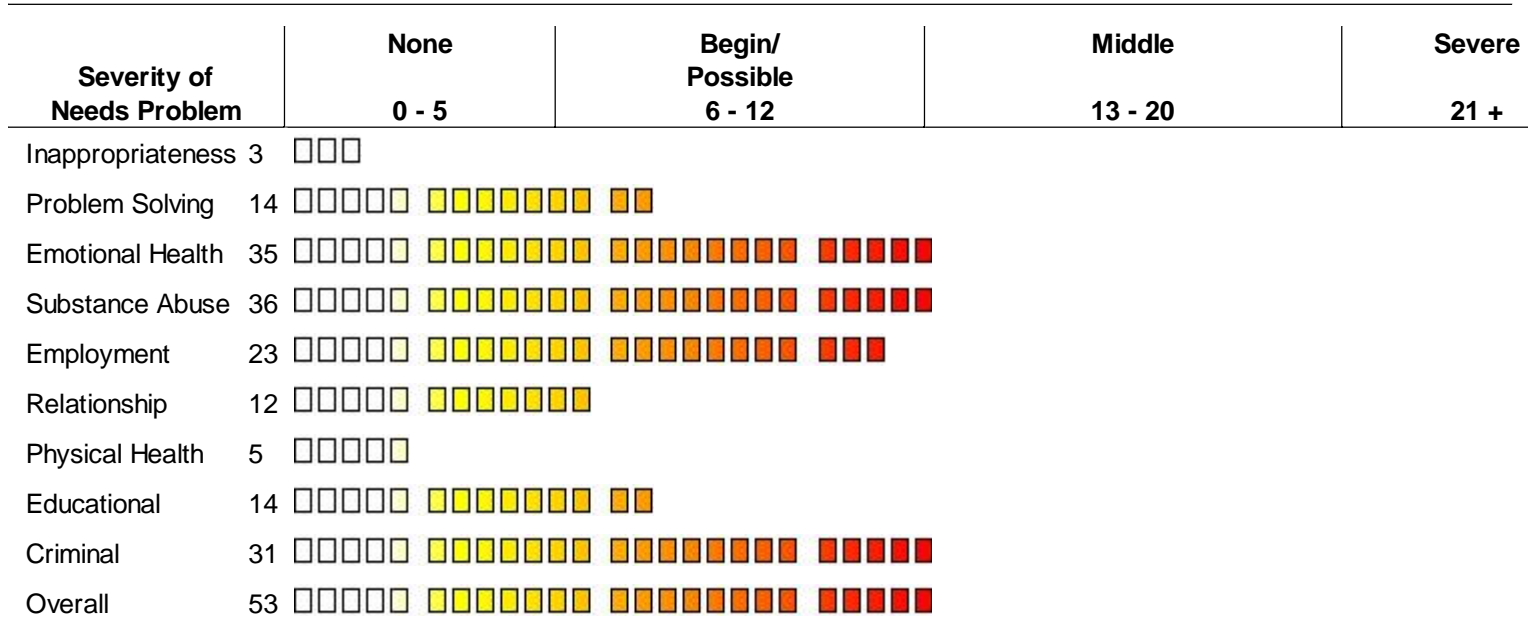
Supervision Level
